<u>Has this area (Perea) changed since you were young? If yes, how?</u>
 Interview1: Perea used to be a village with old houses with gardens, no blocks of flats at all. There were no roads and people used to come in the 6o's and 70's here by boat for a swim in the sea.

Interview 2: It has changed a lot and they have built new buildings. **Interview 3:** A lot has changed here in Perea.

- <u>Have buildings replaced farms, fields and forests?</u>
 Interview1: Yes they have. Now there are blocks of flats.
 Interview 2: Yes, of course. The forests were destroyed by the farmers.

 Interview 2: I haven't noticed.
 Interview 3: Back in those days I used to dive from the jetty but now the sea has pulled in.
- Are there any rivers or streams in Perea? Are they different now from when you were young? (Has the flow changed? Is there more water, less water, dried up, dirtier, cleaner?)

 Interview 1: Yes, they are.
 Interview 2: Yes, the summers and winters are warmer.

Do you believe there is global warming?
Interview 1: Yes, there is and this is the reason the seasons have changed.
Interview 2: Yes, I believe in global warming.
