

History

- With the outbreak of World War I and the conflict between Russia, Turkey -in the Caucasus- and Persia, the current government started to be afraid of the Armenian citizen. For the reason that Russian's army's one section were Armenians





In 1915 the Armenians moved to present-day Syria, where many died or were murdered, during the movement, with the result that these events are nowadays described as the Armenian Genocide. The 24th of April is celebrated as a day of remembrance.

Language and Music

They have their own language and alphabet which consists of 39 letters. Their music begins as early as the 6th century B.C.



Cuisine

• Their cuisine is very popular grilled meats, lamb and chicken. Their food is very nutritious, they use 300 kinds of herbs. Many of their dishes are also widespread in Greece such as moussaka, soutzoukakia, kandaifi and baklava. It is also famous for its wine and cognac.
